

Kalu Ojah is on the staff of Wits Business School, at the University of Witwatersrand, as a Full Professor of Finance and Director of the Master in Finance & Investment. He holds a BSc. in Management/Economics (ORU, USA), and both MFn. and Ph.D. in Finance (Saint Louis, USA). He has been in Higher Education for more than fifteen years, teaching and researching in major Business Schools such as St John's University's Tobin College of Business (New York, USA), Saint Louis University's Cook Business School (Missouri, USA), Florida A&M University's School of Business and Industry (Florida, USA), Wayne State University's Business School (Michigan, USA), and UAE University's Global Leadership & Management Graduate Program (Abu-Dhabi, UAE). He has also garnered invaluable socio-cultural experiences by living and working in several regions of the world: North America, Europe, Middle East and Africa.

Besides developing important programs and training budding experts in Finance and Economics, he is a very active researcher with more than fifty (peer-reviewed and conference presentations / proceedings) articles to his name. Many of these articles appear in reputed international journals such as *Financial Review*, *Journal of International Business Studies*, *Review of Quantitative Finance & Accounting*, *Journal of Development Studies*, *Applied Financial Economics*, *Review of Financial Economics*, and *Applied Economics*. Several of these articles have won awards, been extensively cited or earned honorable mentions. His main areas of research interest are, broadly speaking, financial markets, corporate finance and governance, financial economics and international business.
