He was previously a Senior Lecturer at the Department of Finance, Business School, University of Ghana, Legon and also served as one time Head of Department. He has served on various University Administration Committees and continues to do so. Charles currently teaches Finance & Development (PGD) Research Methodology of Development Finance (MPhil), Global Development Finance (PhD). He previously taught Financial Economics, Econometrics for Finance, Managerial Economics, Monetary Theory, Elements of Economics, and International Trade & Theory at various levels in various years at the University of Ghana. He has graduated over seventy (70) Masters Students (MPhil/MBA) a PhD in Finance from the University of Ghana and currently supervises five PhD students in the area of Development Finance at the University of Stellenbosch.
