Mr Motelle Sephooko Ignatius is a Senior Economist in the Research Department of the Central bank of Lesotho responsible for, among other tasks, supervision of the Money and Banking Section as well as undertaking research on financial and monetary issues. He has worked as a Dealer in the Treasury Department of Nedbank Lesotho (ldt) for two years (2002-2004) and was later appointed a consultant on Treasury Operations in both the foreign exchange and money market desks for half a year (June 2004 – December 2004) in the same commercial bank. He served Serumula Development Association (SDA) – a Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO) that receives mandates on rural development, water conservation and leadership capacity building from Food and Agricultural Organisation (FAO) and Kellogg Foundation among others – as an Economic Consultant in 2004 and was later appointed an Economic Advisor to the SDA Management in 2008-2009. He currently serves as a member of the Board of Directors in the same organisation.

Mr Motelle is currently a Lecturer at the National University of Lesotho (NUL) where he teaches Monetary Economics. He has published several articles in refereed journals, Central Bank of Lesotho working papers, and magazines articles. His research interests stem from Development Economics, Monetary Economics and Financial Economics. Sephooko graduated with a BA (Econ) from the NUL in 2002 where he received Moabi Mapetla Memorial Award for exceptional performance. He also holds an MCom (Econ) from the University of Stellenbosch.
